NATURAL RESOURCE SPECIALIST

Salary Range: \$36,800-\$58,600 per year

Duty Locations: Throughout the nation

Job Summary: The organization is the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, Wyoming State Office. The Rawlins Field Office consists of 12.5 million acres in south-central Wyoming, including the eastern third of Sweetwater County as well as all of Carbon, Albany and Laramie counties. Within that area, the Rawlins Field Office is responsible for the management of 3.5 million acres of public lands and approximately 4.5 million acres of federal mineral estate.

Salary Range: \$45,000- \$54,500 per year

Duty Locations: Throughout the nation

Job Summary: The Department of Agriculture's Forest Service is the nation's leading forest management agency. It is an organization of more than 30,000.

Major Duties: The scientist will prepare reports that investigate or render soils and ecological information; use analytical methods and techniques to analyze a wide range of scientific, environmental and soil management issues; and carry out soil surveys, classifying and mapping soils based on the study and measurement of their significant characteristics.

FEDERAL EMPLOYERS CAN HELP YOU REPAY YOUR STUDENT LOANS

- ★ Agencies are authorized to help repay up to \$10,000 of a loan per year, up to \$60,000 total per employee.
- ★ An employee who receives student loan repayments must commit to remaining in the service of the federal government for at least three years.
- ★ In FY 2007, **33 federal agencies** provided **6,619 employees** with almost **\$42 million** in student loan repayment.

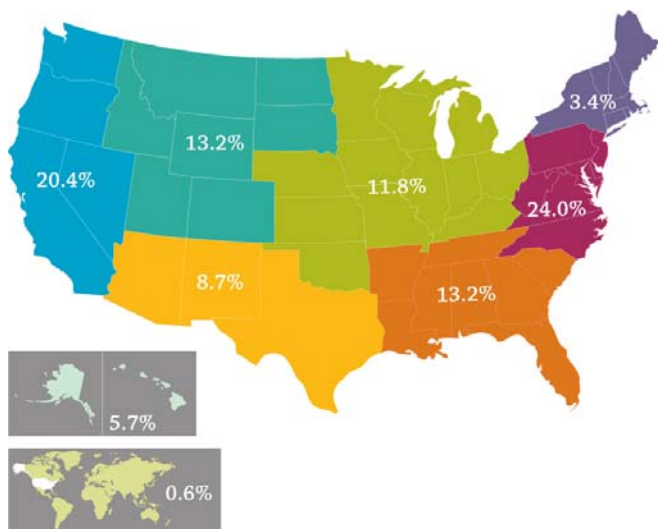

WHERE THE JOBS ARE

By September of 2009, our largest federal agencies project that they will hire nearly 193,000 new workers for "mission-critical" jobs.

This includes:

- ★ 1,041 forestry technicians/ specialists at the Department of Agriculture
- ★ 552 soil conservation technicians/specialists at the Department of Agriculture
- ★ 159 fishery biologists at the Department of Commerce
- ★ 15 toxicologists at the Environmental Protection Agency
