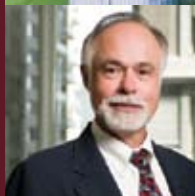

The medals honor people who have shown a strong commitment to public service and have made a significant contribution in their field of government that is innovative, high-impact and critical for the nation.

Federal Employee of Year Medal

Recognizing professional contributions that exemplify the highest attributes of public service.

Career Achievement Medal

Recognizing significant accomplishments throughout a lifetime of achievement in public service.

Call to Service Medal

Recognizing professional achievements made by a new generation dedicated to public service.

Medals in Specific Government Fields

Recognizing significant contributions to the nation in activities related to:

- ★ Citizen Services
- ★ Homeland Security
- ★ Justice and Law Enforcement
- ★ National Security and International Affairs
