FEDERAL EMPLOYERS CAN HELP YOU REPAY YOUR STUDENT LOANS

- ★ Agencies are authorized to help repay up to \$10,000 of a loan per year, up to \$60,000 total per employee.
- ★ An employee who receives student loan repayments must commit to remaining in the service of the federal government for at least three years.
- ★ In 2006, the federal government provided **5,755 employees with \$36 million** in loan repayment.

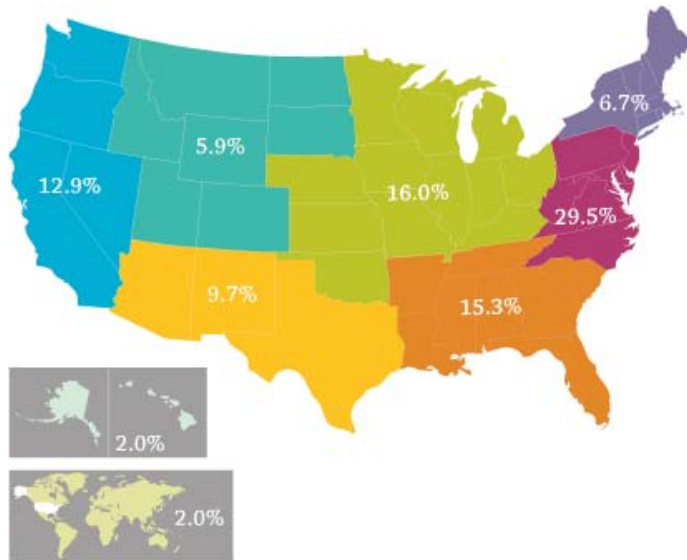

Federal Law Enforcement Profile

William Fleming and Ben Herren *Agents of Justice*

It was one of the most horrific events in the long struggle for African-American civil rights. Four young girls in the 16th Street Baptist Church were killed when a dynamite bomb planted outside exploded. It wasn't until 1977 that Robert Chambliss was found guilty and sentenced to life in prison, where he later died. Two other killers remained beyond the grasp of the law for nearly 40 years.

In 1996, the Birmingham FBI office reopened the case and assigned it to Special Agent William Fleming and Ben Herren, then a Birmingham police sergeant. Despite long odds that had thwarted investigations in 1965 and 1977, Fleming and Herren went to work.

As they meticulously dug through old files, Fleming uncovered crucial tape recordings of Thomas Blanton's conversations originally recorded during the initial investigation. He and Herren spent hundreds of hours reviewing the tapes; their contents proved to be essential evidence against Blanton and Bobby Frank Cherry. Both men were found guilty of murder and are now serving life sentences.

WHERE THE JOBS ARE

Over the next two years, our largest federal agencies project that they will hire nearly 193,000 new workers for "mission-critical" jobs.

- ★ 37,249 transportation security officers at the Department of Homeland Security
- ★ 16,477 correctional officers at the Department of Justice

- ★ 2,552 police officers at the Department of Veterans Affairs
