The *Excellence in Government Fellows* program strengthens the leadership skills of GS-14 and GS-15 federal employees through a proven combination of innovative coursework, best practices benchmarking, challenging action-learning projects, executive coaching and government-wide networking. Our program meets the interagency training requirements for OPM-approved candidate development programs.

Coursework: Leaders Teaching Leaders

The *Excellence in Government Fellows* program brings world-class public-, private- and nonprofit-sector leaders together to help Fellows apply leading management principles—including government's Executive Core Qualifications—to their jobs.

Benchmarks: Observing the Best in Action

The Fellows benchmark some of the most successful organizations for a behind-the-scenes look at their strategies for delivering results. Previous benchmarks have included Accenture, Ben & Jerry's, Deloitte, Google, Microsoft, NASA, Procter & Gamble, Starbucks and Teach for America.

Results Projects: Solving Government's Problems

Leaders learn best by doing. Fellows reinforce lessons taught in the classroom by working with agency executives to tackle complex issues confronting our country. Past Fellows have developed strategies for streamlining drug approvals, strengthening collaboration during food recalls and improving recruiting for mission-critical occupations. Fellows will either be assigned to a project by their agency or have the opportunity to select a project of interest.

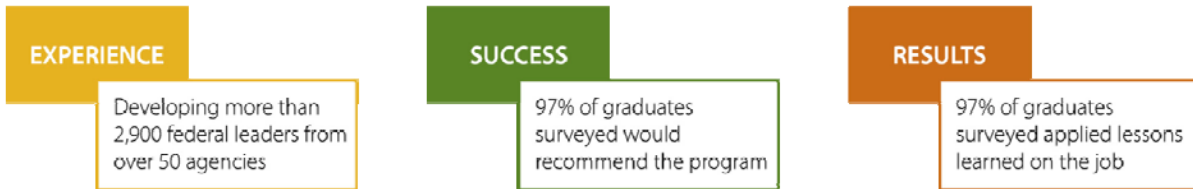
Coaching and Mentoring: Learning from Others' Experience

Coaching is a critical element of leadership development. Fellows receive targeted support from experts and experienced government leaders. In addition, Fellows will have access to the Partnership's extensive network of public-, private- and nonprofit-sector leaders.

Networking: Creating a Cadre of Change Agents

Too often, leaders complete development programs and return to an environment where they feel isolated from the energy and creativity experienced during the program. Our Fellows join a community of leaders, who support continued learning through networking, online forums and other ongoing professional development opportunities.





Participating in the Excellence in Government Fellows Program

Enrollment in the *Excellence in Government Fellows* program is open to government GS-14 or 15 (or equivalent) leaders. Exceptional GS-13 leaders may apply as well.

Time Commitment and Location

During the year-long program, Fellows remain in their full-time jobs, meet every six weeks and spend a total of approximately 20 days in session. Fellows also devote up to five hours per week to their projects. The dates and locations for the program include:

- Values, Vision, and Mission, April 17 – 19, 2012, TBD
- Results, June 5 – 7, 2012, Washington, DC
- Leading People, July 24 – 26, 2012, Washington, DC
- Leading Change, September 18 – 20, 2012, Location TBD
- Building Partnerships and Coalitions, November 13 -15, 2012, TBD
- Business Acumen, January 22 – 24, 2013, Washington, DC
- Synthesis and Celebration, March 5 – 7, 2013, Washington, DC

Tuition

Tuition for the *Excellence in Government Fellows* program is \$9,900* and includes:

- All coaching and facilitation;
- Course materials (e.g., books, articles and management tools);
- Assessments, one-on-one coaching and individualized development planning;
- Online collaboration tools;
- Access to the Partnership’s resources, expertise and networks; and
- Invitations to ongoing activities (e.g., events of excellence, continuing education programs).

*Sponsoring organizations are responsible for travel expenses associated with the program. For Fellows located in the Washington, DC metropolitan area the estimated cost for travel is approximately \$2,900 per Fellow.
